1- Board Introduction (Estate Branch)

Faisalabad Board is located on the Jhang Road adjacent to Air Avenue Colony Faisalabad. Initially it was located in Agriculture University Faisalabad near Allied Hospital. In early 90's Board purchased 28 (224 Canal) Acres of Land for the construction of Board building. In 2010 board shifted in the newly constructed state of the art building. This huge building and infrastructure needs proper care, management and security for its smooth functioning. There comes the Estate branch. Estate branch is perhaps the largest branch in terms of diversity of work and purpose. Estate branch is responsible for the overall maintenance, care and functioning of board building. Before going into the details of its functions let's have a look into position of Estate Officer.

The Post of Estate Officer is BPS-18. This position is filled through direct appointment. Mr. RANA AMJAD ALI KHAN was selected as Estate Officer of Board and since then he is performing his duties very efficiently. He is a Grade-18 officer well versed with the matters of Estate management and maintenance. He has excellent coordination and command over its staff. His management and development skills are incredible. This is the reason BISE Faisalabad has never faced any issue related to security, repair, management and cleanliness.

The work of estate branch like other branches of the board is 24/7 around the year as it has to maintain the security of the board. Diversity of the staff can be gauged by the presence of variety of skilled work man in the estate branch. These are:

- 1) Ministerial staff: Superintendent, Assistant, Clerk, Naib Qasid
- 2) Skilled Workers: Gardner, Electrician, Carpenter, Plumber, Mason, Sweepers and Sanitary Staff
- 3) Security Staff: Security staff is headed by Mr. Muhammad Arshad. All of the security personnel are very trained and professional personnel and mostly are Ex-force man.

Functions of Estate branch: Following are main Functions of Estate branch;

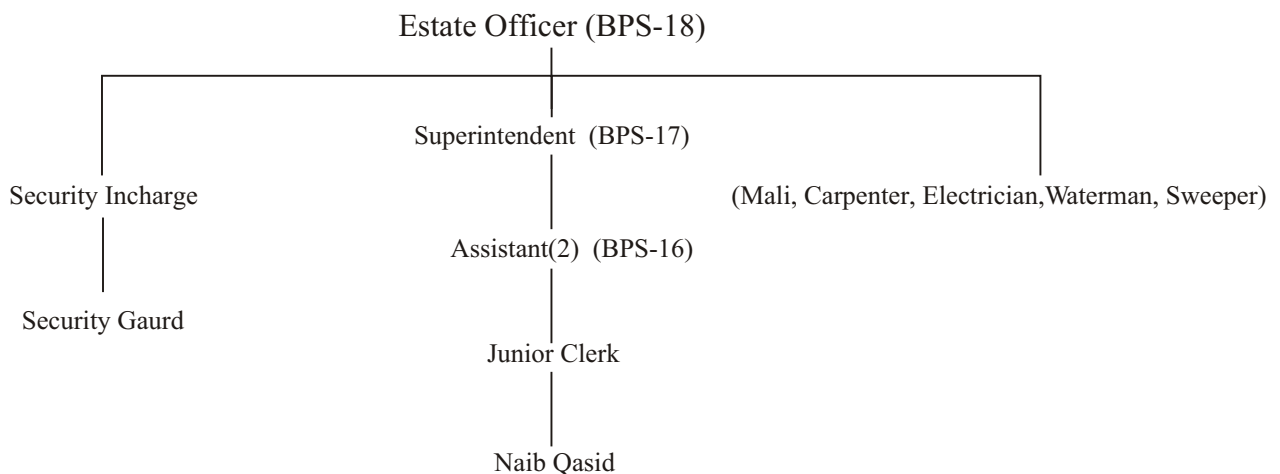
- 1) Security of overall board

5- Marking Center Visit by Chairperson Board

Chairperson BISE Faisalabad takes keen interest in the marking process to ensure dispensation of reward to students for their hard work. Paper marking is a very crucial process that has very far reaching impacts on the future life of a student. Therefore, BISE Faisalabad tries its level best to make this process perfect, errorless and judicious. For this purpose subject specialist of established credibility and integrity are hired for marking from Government Schools and Colleges of Faisalabad Division.

To make this process of marking more efficient and transparent BISE Faisalabad has established model marking centers at Tehsil and District level of Faisalabad Division. These marking centers are operational from 8: Am to 8: Pm, where Marking staff works in shifts under the supervision of Supervisory staff of established repute and knowledge to ensure right full assessment of students answer sheets. Chairperson BISE Faisalabad is tirelessly inspecting the marking centers under the board jurisdiction to ensure standard level checking of answer sheets in order to establish transparency, standard assessment and merit. These efforts over the last two years have born the fruit in shape of increased level of student's satisfaction and confidence on their results and examination system.



6- Plantation Drive

Government of Pakistan has put great emphasis on the protection and safety of our Planet Earth in a number of ways. Our Planet earth is currently undergoing excessive exploitation and abuse by "Us" the Humans. We have deprived the Mother Nature of its original beauty and glory just to fulfill our unfathomable greed. 7- Promotion Policy (SSC and HSSC) 2021

In exercise of powers conferred under subsection (6) of section 12 of Punjab Boards of Intermediate and Secondary Education Act, 1976(XIII of 1976), and in supersession of Notification No.S.O.(Boards) 13-1/2020, dated 30.07.2021, Governor of the Punjab is pleased to issue following directions to the boards of Intermediate and secondary education for the conduct of annual examination and declaration of results of all examinations, 2021 in the backdrop of COVID-19, with immediate effect:

Higher Secondary School Certificate (HSSC) Examination

- 1) The candidates of HSSC (Part-II) Examination 2021 in the below-mentioned categories shall appear in Part-II elective subjects only. The average marks obtained in Elective subjects (Part-II) shall be reflected in Compulsory subjects of the Part-II with 5% additional marks. All those who fail in any subject, shall be granted 33% marks. The same marks shall be awarded for Part-I corresponding subjects:
 - i) Appearing in Part-II
 - ii) Appearing for composite Examinations
 - iii) Re-appearing in Part-I and appearing in part-II
 - iv) Re-appearing in both Part-I and Part-II
 - v) Re-appearing in Part-II only
 - vi) Appearing for marks improvement in Part-I and part-II
 - vii) Appearing for Marks improvement in Part-II
 - viii) Appearing for Marks improvement (Subject-wise) except in Compulsory subject(s).
 - ix) Appearing in Shahadat-ul- Sa'anvia Khasa and Medical Technologies Group.
- 2- The candidates Re-appearing for HSSC Part-I examination 2021, need not to appear for examinations. They shall be awarded average marks obtained previously in all pass subjects of Part-I.
- 3- The candidates of HSSC appearing for marks improvement in Part-I examination 2021 shall appear in elective subjects for HSSC part-I. The average marks obtained in pass subjects (Part-I) shall be reflected in compulsory subjects of Part-I with addition of 5% marks. All those who fail in any subject, shall be granted 33% marks.

- 3- The candidates of HSSC appearing for marks improvement in Part-I examination 2021 shall appear in elective subjects for HSSC part-I. The average marks obtained in pass subjects (Part-I) shall be reflected in compulsory subjects of Part-I with addition of 5% marks. All those who fail in any subject, shall be granted 33% marks.
- 4- The candidates appearing for Marks improvement or Re-appearing in compulsory subjects of HSSC examination 2021 only, need not to appear in examination. They shall be awarded percentage of average marks obtained previously in all pass subjects of relevant Part-I or Part-II, respectively.
- 5- The candidates appearing for additional subjects in HSSC (Annual) Examination 2021 shall appear in the relevant subject(s) in Part-II. The marks obtained in additional subject or subjects of Part-II shall be awarded for corresponding subject or subjects of Part-I. All those who fail in any subject, shall be granted 33% marks.
- 6- The candidates of nursing/Homeopathic, etc and classical languages group (Aloom-e-Sharqia), and candidates seeking equivalence from IBCC shall be examined in all relevant subjects of HSSC. The policy of 33% marks shall be implemented for these candidates as well.
- 7- The candidates appearing for HSSC Part-I as fresh candidates shall appear in Part-I elective subject only. The average marks obtained in pass subjects (Part-I) shall be reflected in remaining compulsory subjects of the Part-I with 5% additional marks. All those who fail in any subject, shall be granted 33% marks.

Secondary School Certificate (SSC) Examinations

- 8- The candidates of SSC (Part-II) examination 2021 in below mentioned categories shall appear in Part-II Elective Subjects and Mathematics only. The average marks obtained in Elective subjects (Part-II) shall be reflected in compulsory subjects of the Part-II with 5% additional marks. All those who fail in any subject, shall be granted 33% marks. The same marks shall be awarded for Part-I corresponding subjects:
 - i) Appearing in Part-II
 - ii) Appearing for composite examinations
 - iii) Re-appearing in Part-I and appearing in Part-II
 - iv) Re-appearing in both Part-I and Part-II
 - v) Re-appearing in Part-II only
 - vi) Appearing for marks improvement in Part-I and Part-II
 - vii) Appearing for marks improvement in Part-II
 - viii) Appearing for marks improvement (subject-wise) except in compulsory subject or subjects.
- 9- The candidates re-appearing for SSC Part (I) Examinations 2021, need not to appear for examination. They shall be awarded average marks obtained previously in all pass subjects of Part-I.
- 10- The candidates of SSC appearing for marks improvement in Part-I Examinations 2021 shall appear in Elective subjects and Mathematics for SSC Part-I. The average marks obtained in pass subjects (Part-I) shall be reflected in Compulsory subjects of the Part-I with 5% additional marks. All those who fail in any subject, shall be granted 33% marks.
- 11- The candidates appearing for marks improvement or Re-appearing in Compulsory subjects of SSC Examination 2021 only, need not to appear in Examination. They shall be awarded percentage of average marks obtained previously in all pass subjects of relevant Part-I and Part-II respectively.
- 12- The candidates appearing for additional subjects in SSC (Annual) examinations 2021 shall appear in the relevant subject(s) in Part-II. The marks obtained in additional subject(s) Part-II shall be awarded for corresponding subject(s) of Part-I. All those who fail in any subject, shall be granted 33% marks.
- 13- The candidates of Shahadat-ul- Sa'anvia Aa'ma and O' Level, etc. streams seeking equivalence from IBCC shall be examined in all the relevant subjects to get equivalence for SSC. All those who fail in any subject, shall be granted 33% marks.
- 14- The candidates appearing for SSC Part-I as fresh candidates shall appear in Part-I Elective subject and Mathematics only. The average marks obtained in pass subjects (Part-I) shall be reflected in Compulsory subjects of part-I with 5% additional marks. All those who fail in any subject, shall be granted 33% marks.
- 15- The practical Examinations of HSSC/SSC Examinations 2021 shall not be conducted and marks for the same shall be awarded to only qualifying candidates, as follows:

50% marks of the total practical marks shall be granted to all qualifying candidates while remaining 50% marks be awarded proportionate to their theory marks in the relevant subject.
- 16- The candidates of SSC and HSSC Part-II(Annual) Examinations 2021, who were absent in the examination or who do not accept the award of 33% passing marks in the failed subjects, may appear in Special Examination to be held in November 2021. Such candidates shall be required to declare in writing their option to appear in the Special Examination 2021 within fifteen days of the declaration of results.

- 17- The candidates of SSC and HSSC (Part-I) at the time of declaration of their result, shall be given thirty days time period to decide if they want to retain their score or they want to opt for Composite Examination, their result of Part-I shall be cancelled or quashed and it shall not be counted in the number of chances availed and chances for improvement of score shall also remain intact.
- 18- The Boards of Intermediates and Secondary Education shall mention the following statement in the transcript and certificate of Intermediate and Secondary Education for Part-I and II (2021&2022):
“The marks awarded are the best prediction of the performance and has been awarded under COVID-19 Examination policy, hence considered as valid and fair.”
- 19- This policy is valid for the examinations and results of 2021 only.
- 20- In case of any grievance under these directions, an application, in writing, to address the grievances, shall be filed before the Punjab Boards Committee of Chairmen (PBCC) which shall decide the matter within thirty days of the receipt of application and the decision made by the aforementioned committee shall be final.

8- Tenders and Auctions
